ARTICLE 9: To see if the Town will vote to accept MGL Chapter 48 § 42:

“Towns accepting the provisions of this section, or which have accepted corresponding provisions of earlier laws may establish a fire department to be under the control of an officer to be known as the chief of the fire department. The chief shall be appointed by the selectmen, and shall receive such salary as the selectmen may from time to time determine, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount annually appropriated therefor. He may be removed for cause by the selectmen at any time after a hearing. He shall have charge of extinguishing fires in the town and the protection of life and property in case of fire. He shall purchase subject to the approval of the selectmen and keep in repair all property and apparatus used for and by the fire department. He shall have and exercise all the powers and discharge all the duties conferred or imposed by statute upon engineers in towns except as herein provided, and shall appoint a deputy chief and such officers and firemen as he may think necessary, and may remove the same at any time for cause and after a hearing. He shall have full and absolute authority in the administration of the department, shall make all rules and regulations for its operation, shall report to the selectmen from time to time as they may require, and shall annually report to the town the condition of the department with his recommendations thereon; he shall fix the compensation of the permanent and call members of the fire department subject to the approval of the selectmen. In the expenditure of money the chief shall be subject to such further limitations as the town may from time to time prescribe. The appointment of the chief of the fire department in any town or district having a population of five thousand or less may be for a period of three years.”

ARTICLE 10: To see if the Town will vote to accept MGL Chapter 41, § 97A:

“Section 97A. In any town which accepts this section there shall be a police department established by the selectmen, and such department shall be under the supervision of an officer to be known as the chief of police. The selectmen of any such town shall appoint a chief of police and such other officers as they deem necessary, and fix their compensation, not exceeding, in the aggregate, the annual appropriation therefor. In any such town in which such appointments are not subject to chapter thirty-one, they shall be made annually or for a term of years not exceeding three years, as the selectmen shall determine, and the selectmen may remove such chief or other officers for cause at any time after a hearing. The chief of police in any such town shall from time to time make suitable regulations governing the police department, and the officers thereof, subject to the approval of the selectmen; provided, that such regulations shall become effective without such approval upon the failure of the selectmen to take action thereon within thirty days after they have been submitted to them by the chief of police. The chief of police in any such town shall be in immediate control of all town property used by the department, and of the police officers, whom he shall assign to their respective duties and who shall obey his orders. Section ninety-seven shall not apply in any town which accepts the provisions of this section. Acceptance of the provisions of this section shall be by a vote at an annual town meeting.”

Citizen’s petition to the Rowe Board of Selectmen: To see if the town will vote to adopt the following Resolution: **Resolution** in Support of Changing the State Flag and Seal of Massachusetts

Whereas the history of the State of Massachusetts is replete with instances of conflict between the European Colonists and the Native Nations of the region, who first extended the hand of friendship to the Colonists on their shores in 1620, and helped them to survive starvation during the settlers' first winters on their land;

Whereas members of the Native Nation for whom the State of Massachusetts is named were ambushed and killed by Myles Standish, first commander of the Plymouth Colony, in April of 1623, barely two years after the Pilgrims arrived on their shores;

Whereas the naked Colonial broadsword brandished above the head of the Native man on the Massachusetts State Flag and Seal is modeled over Myles Standish's own broadsword, borrowed from the Pilgrim Hall in Plymouth by the illustrator Edmund Garrett in 1884;

Whereas the belt binding the Native's cloak on the Flag and Seal is modeled after a belt worn by Metacomet, known to the English as King Philip, who was among the Wampanoag leaders who resorted to a mutually destructive war in 1675-76 in defense of Native lands against Euro-Colonial encroachment;

Whereas the proportions of the body of the Native man in the Flag and Seal were taken from a Native skeleton kept in Winthrop, the bow modeled after a bow taken from a Native man shot and killed by a colonist in Sudbury in 1665, and his features taken from a photograph of an Ojibwe chief from Great Falls, Montana, considered by the illustrator to be a “fine specimen of an Indian,” though not from Massachusetts;

Whereas the history of relations between Massachusetts since Colonial times and the Native Nations who continue to live within its borders includes the forced internment of thousands of so-called “praying Indians” on Deer Island, in Boston Harbor, where they died by the hundreds of exposure in 1675, their subsequent enslavement in Boston, Bermuda, and the Caribbean Islands, the offering of 40 pounds sterling as bounty for the scalps of Native men, women and children in Massachusetts beginning in 1686, increased to 100 pounds sterling for the scalps of Native adult males by 1722, half that amount for Native women and children;

Whereas Native Nations within the boundaries of Massachusetts were kept in a state of serfdom, and their members legally considered incompetent wards of the state until the nonviolent action of the so-called Mashpee Rebellion of 1833 led to the granting of Native self-rule by the Massachusetts legislature in 1834, as if the sovereign right of Native self-government was the Massachusetts legislature's to confer;

Whereas Native Americans were legally prohibited from even stepping foot into Boston from 1675 until 2004, when that law was finally repealed;

Whereas the 400th anniversary of the landing of the Euro-Colonists at Plymouth Plantation, which gave rise to the long chain of genocidal wars and deliberate policies of cultural destruction against Native Nations of this continent, is approaching in the year 2020, affording every citizen of the Commonwealth a chance to reflect upon this history and come to a new awareness of a better relationship between the descendants of the Euro-Colonial immigrants and the Native Nations of the Commonwealth;

And whereas Native Americans have long suffered the many abuses of racism, the appropriation of their symbols for public schools and sports teams, the diminution and pollution of their ancestral lands and the encroachment of their cultural lifeways;

Now, therefore, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the citizens of Rowe hereby adopt this resolution in support of HD.2968 and SD.1495, a Resolve Providing for the creation of a Special Commission relative to the Seal and Motto of the Commonwealth,” and request that Senator Adam G. Hinds, and Representatives Paul W. Mark, representing Rowe, co-sponsor, support and vote for the aforementioned Resolve (HD.2968 and SD.1495) in the General Court, and that the Joint Committee on State Administration and Regulatory Oversight, after holding a public hearing on the Resolve report it out favorably, and if the legislation shall pass that the governor shall sign it and work with members of the General Court to ensure its enactment.

ARTICLE 30: To see if the Town will vote to **TRANSFER** from **FREE CASH** the sum of **\$67,919.02** to the Stabilization Fund, or take any action in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 31: To see if the Town will vote to **AUTHORIZE** the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept, and expend federal and state grants as may be available, or take any action in relation thereto.

Recommended by Rowe Select Board

ARTICLE 32: To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up attested copies thereof at the **Rowe Town Hall** and the **Rowe Transfer Station** in said Town, fourteen days at least before the time of holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not, and make due return of the Warrant, with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk at the time of said meeting, as aforesaid.

Dear Town Finance Committee,

As members of a municipal Finance Committee, we are charged with serving as a watchdog over town finances and taxpayer money. We do this by developing budgets, making fiscal recommendations, studying past practices, and working with many elected and appointed officials to best serve the people of our communities. No two communities are alike, but we all face some of the same challenges.

The role of Finance Committee is a vital part of our local government. Many times it's filled by veterans of town politics looking to stay involved. But just as often it's filled with newcomers to town government trying to learn how things work. Whether your committee is made up of long-time public servants, fresh faces, or somewhere in between, all members are valuable to the process and play an important part.

Unfortunately finance committees often seem to take a back seat within the region and state in terms of learning opportunities. While there are state associations for various offices, many trainings take place in the eastern part of the state, out of range for many people within this area. And though there are local organizations for Selectmen, Assessors, Police Chiefs, Fire Chiefs, and other important positions, there is no local organization for town finance committees.

Therefore, we would like to reach out to your board to see if your members would be interested in participating in an association of finance committees within Franklin County. When asking yourselves why this might be helpful, consider the following possible goals of such an association:

- To bring members of all town finance committees together. There are approximately 130 active members of committees in Franklin County.
- To serve as a learning forum in an area of the state where there are few resources in general, let alone dedicated to small towns. What happens in Eastern Massachusetts is very different than what happens out here.
- To serve as a learning forum in an area of the state where there are committees made up mostly of volunteers, and quite often with little to no prior town government experience.

- To focus on topics that affect our region (declining school enrollment, pressure from the state to regionalize services, minimal businesses, etc.)
- To give a larger audience to bring in potential speakers from state agencies.
- To advocate for the role of the Finance Committee in small communities. These are important committees that are sometimes under-utilized.
- To keep members up-to-date on the happenings of the region. For example, if one school is regionalizing to save money, it might be helpful for other towns to know the processes, how it's going, how much has been saved, etc.
- To keep members up-to-date on financing opportunities like grants from the state and federal government.

At this point in time, we are not asking for any commitment from the members of your committee. All we would like to do is gauge interest in this idea, and whether there is sufficient support in the region for forming a group.

Enclosed is a stamped postcard. We ask that you simply check off whether your committee might be interested, and how many members have shown interest. Based on responses, we will determine a next step and will be in touch.

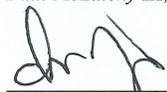

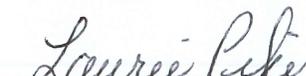
