

Board of Health
Meeting Minutes
September 15, 1987

Present: Ellen Foberg, George Riggan, Marion Boggs,

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M.

David Devore (Potter Road) came in to request a variance from the Board of Health regulation requiring a septic system be constructed a minimum of seventy-five feet from a property line. He stated that at the time a percolation test was performed on his property on Potter Road he had informed the Board of Health that he wished to subdivide his property. There was a discussion of the siting of the present leach field for Mr. Devore's residence and the location of the percolation test. In view of a possible error in judgment on the part of the Board of Health members present at this percolation test, and their failure to take into account the line of subdivision and the 75 foot requirement, Mr. Riggan made a motion that a variance be granted for the construction of a septic system closer to the line than 75 feet. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Mrs. Foberg reported that test holes were dug on Saturday, September 12, 1987 at the residence of Timothy Johnston (Hazelton Road) where the existing system has failed. Mr. Brickett will design a system for the location.


Two percolation tests were performed at Yankee Atomic Electric Company on Monday, September 14th for an inadequate system. The test performed near the training center failed and the test performed near the parking lot passed.




The meeting adjourned at 8:00 P.M.
